Located near Mifflintown, Fermanagh Township, Juniata County, Pennsylvania

From Route 22/322, take the exit for Route 35 toward McAlisterville. Go 0.2 mile to light near the Sheetz gas station. Furn left onto Butcher Shop Road. Go 0.9 mile to path for Hochstetler graves on your left.

Just before you arrive, notice a sign, "Winding road one mile". On your right, there will be a dark brown shed that houses a small John Deere farm equipment museum on the hill. The attached photo below shows a triangular lawn with a few park benches. The yellow arrow sign points directly toward the well maintained walking path across the road. The Hochstetler graves are located approximately 500 feet from the road on an easy trek through the wooded section. You may notice a small picnic grove on your right just before you reach the tiny cemetery enclosed with black iron fence.

If you come to the Brubaker Road on your right, you just missed it. The walking path is just behind you. Also around the next curve is a home with white picket fence along the road. This is the home of the property owners, Don & Loma Saner.

If you are interested, the restored Hochstetler home is located 0.1 mile on Brubaker Road. The dark brown with rust rim barn is visible from Butcher Shop Road.
